Students will be taught in intensive or semi-intensive mode by distinguished academics from Monash University and partner law schools. In small classes and state-of-the-art facilities, you will enjoy a unique study experience with students from international and local partner universities. At the same time, the Law Malaysia Program offers sufficient flexibility to allow you to experience in your spare time the cultural and natural attractions of Malaysia and the South-East Asian region.

There will be a welcome dinner at the commencement of the Malaysia Law Program where you will have the opportunity to meet fellow participants from other countries.

The program will also include visits to local legal institutions and meetings with members of Malaysia's legal profession.

Program information

Units are taught in semi-intensive or intensive mode with typically a combination of methods (exam, assignment, participation, etc) used for assessment. Course material will be available at the beginning of the program, or earlier where possible.
